Pope Francis - Humility on Christian Life

Humility marked the theme of his Wednesday General Audience held in Saint Peter's Square and the conclusion of his cycle of catechesis on the virtues. The Pope illustrated how humility is at the foundation of Christian life as we "acknowledge that we are creatures of God and strive to live accordingly." Humility is the "great antagonist of the most mortal of sins, namely arrogance," the Pope began, and whereas pride and arrogance make us think we are greater than we are, "humility restores everything to its correct dimension: we are wonderful creatures, but we are limited, with qualities and flaws." The Pope recalled how the Bible reminds us "we are dust, and to dust we shall return" (cf. Gen 3:19), and we must be on guard against the danger the "delirium of omnipotence" that can often arise in the human heart. Pope Francis explained how humility is key to Christian life and helps bring peace to the world and harmony in the Church.

Feast Of the Most Holy Trinity

With the Solemnity of Pentecost last Sunday, the Easter Season came to an end. On Monday, we began Ordinary Time, that is, the period when priests wear the colour green, a time during which we are called to live the Gospel in the ordinariness of everyday life, witnessing the joy of being disciples of the crucified and risen Jesus. This feast invites us to consider what we believe about God, who has revealed himself to us in the Trinity, one God in three Persons. The Gospel for this Solemnity is taken from the Gospel of Matthew. In its conclusion, Matthew's Gospel quickly moves from the disciples' discovery of Jesus' empty tomb and Jesus' appearance to Mary Magdalene to the commission that Jesus gives to his disciples.
