Birthday of St John the Baptist 24th June:

Only three birthdays are celebrated on the Church's liturgical calendar, the Nativity of Our Lord (December 25), the Nativity of His Mother (September 8), and the Nativity of His forerunner, John the Baptist, on June 24. Saint John the Baptist was set apart from the womb to prepare the way of the Lord and was a significant figure connected to the Incarnation and the Redemption.

The Church honors him because of his role in preparing the way for Christ. John the Baptist was born to Saint Elizabeth, who was a kinswoman of the Blessed Virgin Mary making Jesus and Saint John related, as well.

The most common term of relation suggested for the two is "cousin," though the exact degree is unknown. The idea of ritual washing was part of Jewish practice. For those who were not Jewish by birth, it was part of their conversion. However, it was not a proper sacrament as it did not confer grace, as do the Christian sacraments.

The baptism of John, on the other hand, was a step toward the Sacraments of the Church, in that it pointed not back to the Law of Moses, but forward to the Law of Christ, "unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God" It could be called a sacramental, sacrament-like. The true Sacrament of Baptism, however, would await Christ's institution, and through its sin would be forgiven and the Holy Spirit conferred.

Amalgamation of Presentation NS & Castlecomer Boys NS:

The Trustee (Bishop Coll), Boards of Management, Principles and Staff, Parents and pupils have been liaising with The Dept of Education on the process for Co-Educational status and practice for our schools. Parents, pupils and staff have already started to address the first of many steps; naming of the 'new' school, as requested by Dept of Education. The Trustee has asked that a Saint name be considered. All Parishioners, (including past pupils) are invited to participate in this process.
