All parishioners are invited to join with the Castlecomer Community school at a prayer service as they start their new academic year on Tuesday 15th October at 12(noon) in the parish church.

ST CANICE

On 11th October we celebrated the Feast of St Canice. One of four saints of our diocese Canice or Cainneach of Aghaboe is associated with the monastery of Aghaboe and of course the city of Kilkenny. The city gets its name from being the 'Church of Canice'. One of 12 Apostles of Ireland Canice was born in c515 near Dungiven in Ulster. A disciple of Finnian of Clonard he befriended Colmcille at Clonard. Having been ordained in Rome he spent time in Scotland before returning to Ireland and finally establishing a monastery in Aghaboe – 'the Field of the Ox'. Canice founded a monastery near what is now St Canice's Cathedral. Together with St Kieran (Ciarán of Saigir) he is one of the patrons of Kilkenny.

CONGRATULATIONS TO FR MICHAEL SHORTALL

Congrats to Castlecomer native Fr Michael Shortal who has been appointed President of St Patrick's College Maynooth. This is a wonderful appointment for Fr Michael and involves him in very important work in the Irish church: President of our National Seminary and the training of young priests, President of the Pontifical University which provides theological formation for students who undertake courses in theology to prepare them to work in the Irish Church and Catholic Schools.

Prisoners Sunday - 13th October

Prisons Sunday encourages us to pray for prisoners and their families, victims of crime and their communities and those working or volunteering in the criminal justice system. It is also an opportunity for us to think about how we, as individuals, as a Church, and as a community, can serving our brothers and sisters affected by imprisonment.

Prisoners, people with convictions, and their children and families can find themselves on the margins of our society. They are often forgotten or come lower down on the list of causes to 'hold a handout to'. But the gospel of Matthew 25: 36 reminds us of our duties towards them: "I was in prison and you came to see me".

We should draw on the values of our faith; dignity, solidarity, and subsidiarity, and believe everyone can make a fresh start, whatever they may have done.

THE SYNOD ON SYNODALITY

What are the main questions and themes for the 2024 synod assembly? The 2024 Instrumentum Laboris, outlines three overarching questions: How can we be more fully a sign and instrument of union with God and of the unity of all humanity? How can we better share gifts and tasks in the service of the Gospel? What processes, structures, and institutions are needed in a missionary synodal Church?

The 2024 *Instrumentum Labori* has avoided emphasizing some controversial topics already discussed in 2023. Instead of addressing these issues they have been delegated to specialized study groups for further examination.

Bishops' Pastoral Letter

The Bishops of Ireland have published a pastoral letter -A Hundred Thousand Welcomes? reminding us of our responsibility to respond the key questions of immigration across our island, and the world. The Letter is available in the church this week and provides a space for us as 'migrant pilgrim people' to contemplate the causes of migration, the gifts that migrants bring to our Church and our country, the economic and social issues we all face in Ireland the important of encounter in building a true sense of belonging in parish and community. everv See www.catholicbishop.ie for a short video presentation and the Letter in full.
