Mass Cards & Christmas Cards

The parish has a selection of Christmas Mass Bouquet and Christmas Shared Mass Bouquet Cards available this year. Fr Doyle and Fr Scriven will celebrate a Tridium of Masses over the Christmas period for the intentions of those who wish to include family and friends through these parish cards.

Mass Cards, signed by Fr Scriven and Fr Doyle, are available in the Parish Office. These Mass Cards carry the name of Castlecomer Parish; the masses will be said by Fr Doyle or Fr Scriven in the parish. In the event that the local clergy cannot celebrate the mass the Mass Intention may be given to another diocesan priest or to a missionary priest through St Patrick's Society Kiltegan or the Columban Missionaries, Dalgan Park. While Mass Cards are available elsewhere often the Priest's signature is indistinct, detail of the vendor is vague and it is hard to receive assurance as to where the masses are said.

NEW PRESIDENT OF US

The Vatican responded to Donald Trump's election through Cardinal Pietro Parolin who wished him much wisdom.

"At the beginning of his mandate, we wish him much wisdom because that is the principal virtue of those who govern, according to the Bible," the cardinal said.

Asked about Mr. Trump's statement during the campaign and after his victory that "I'm not going to start wars, I'm going to stop wars," Cardinal Parolin responded, "Let us hope, we hope, we hope!" But, he added, "I don't think that even he has a magic wand." He emphasized that to end war, "there is a need for much humility, much willingness and the need to seek the interests of humanity as a whole, rather than focusing on particular interests."

The Synod – Inverting the Pyramid

The Synod on Synodality has just concluded with the submission of its Final Report and its full and unqualified acceptance by Pope Francis. It is now part of the teaching of the Church. This three-year process of discernment, consultation, assemblygathering and final deliberation is now over, and it has been an astonishing success – but not in the way many may think, Maria Grazia in The Tablet suggests.

Pope Francis is embedding a culture of encounter, a pattern of deep listening and a reverencing of the other, in the life of the Church. Francis has spoken of "inverting the pyramid" and so the top-down model that has prevailed for centuries is being replaced by a percolation of missional energy and vision from the bottom up. Francis is not an innovator pope: no new doctrines, no sundering departures from past practices.

But he is a disruptor pope: he has dismantled the established pattern of past synods, including expectations of how popes should be involved; he has freed the synod to be constructively creative rather than cautious. He is determined to bring the teachings of the Second Vatican Council fully into the life of the Church – and so he seeks to 'invert the pyramid'.
